Long Distance Escapades

Thinking of making a journey by bike over several days, in stages, over distances of ten to even hundreds of km? Our long distance itineraries – often known as veloroutes and euroveloroutes allow you to travel right across the region. Easy to use signposting, safe and suited to all fitness levels these escapades will guide you through some incredible adventures.

Here are the ones traversing Wallonia:

Itinerary 0: La Véloroute des Capitales (The Capitals Cycle Route)

Itinerary 1: Entre Dendre et Haut Pays (Between the River Dendre and Haut Pays) **Itinerary 2:** La Véloroute de la Biere *(The Beer Route)*

Itinerary 3: La Véloroute des Carnavals (*The Carnival Route*)

Itinerary 4: Canaux, Fleuves et Rivières (*Canals, Rivers and Streams*)

Itinerary 5: D'une vallée à l'autre (From one Valley to Another)

Itinerary 6: Au Fils de L'eau (Along the River)

Itinerary 7: Sur la Route des Ardennes *(The Ardennes Route)*

Itinerary 8: Entre Fagnes et Famenne (*Between Fagnes and Famenne*)

Itinerary 9: La Véloroute Grandeur Nature (*The Full Nature Cycling Route*) Eurovelo 3 – The Pilgrims Route Spanning the breadth of Belgium, this 200km route gives you a good overview of Wallonia's cities,

good overview of Wallonia's cities, since it crosses Liège, Namur and Charleroi.

Eurovelo 5 – La Via Romea (Francigena)


Via Romea Francigena in Belgium is approximately 400 km long, introducing you to the rich natural, architectural, cultural and brewing heritage of the country.


Eurovelo 19 – River Meuse Route by Bicycle

The Meuse cycle route follows one of the most important rivers in Europe. Through sumptuous settings, with dramatic cliffs, fortresses and castles, you will follow riverside paths through Dinant, Namur and Liege.

La Vennbahn – Cross-country trails

The Vennbahn route is one of Europe's longest and most beautiful greenways, laid out across three countries: Belgium, Germany and Luxembourg. The route leads you through undulating landscapes including the ethereal moorlands of the Haute-Fagnes, the forests and woodlands of the Our Valley in the North.





Wallonia also has a number of cycle routes linked to each other by intersections known locally as 'points-FAMENNE noeuds'. These types of routes are already well known in the Netherlands, but Wallonia is catching up fast. A simple system of numbers and signposts at each intersection makes the different routes easy to follow. Cyclists will find it easy to change the itinerary as the fancy takes them. An average day could entail a long ride in the forest in the morning, with a stop off at a good restaurant for lunch, since many are known for their regionally sourced ingredients. Then perhaps a weird but wonderful festival where beer and strange traditions ensure warm spirits and good cheer. Voila! It's an average bike adventure - Wallonia style. FAMENNE



Waterloo:

Between Memorial and Culture – Let the Battle Commence

Intertwining memorial and culture is a normal state of affairs in a region so steeped in war history and relics from three of Europe's greatest conflicts. This itinerary, set around Waterloo is no exception. The Wellington Museum immediately gives you the heads up on the events of the 18 June 1815 where Wellington and his Prussian allies defeated Napoleon. A brutal offensive that changed the course of history forever. As you cross the Sonian forest with its magnificent centuries old beech trees, you'll discover the Folon Foundation. Set on the farm of the majestic 'Château de La Hulpe', it's where Belgian artist Jean-Michel Folon has installed over 500 art works. The trail then leads you through the Lasnois countryside where you'll arrive into the very heart of the battle of Waterloo site. Stop off to climb the 226 steps leading you to the summit of the iconic Butte du Lion (Lion's Mound), giving you an incredible 360 degree panoramic view of the battlefield below. Take the opportunity to visit the 1815 Memorial Museum which brings the scene to life in emotive multi-sensory sound and vision before ending your ride in the rural town of Braine-l'Alleud.





Foody Tip


Mont St Jean farm in Waterloo is home to a museum and a microbrewery. This historical location once served as a surgical hospital for the British and Allied troops during the famous battle. Visitors can purchase its beers, gins, whiskies as well as other local specialties. All are distilled directly from the beer brewing process and from cereals grown on the battlefield. Try its restaurant for a spot of lunch. It's a battle you'll want to win!

Cerfontaine: Water Water Everywhere...

Eau d'Heure Lakes site, the largest artificial body of water in Belgium – comprises five lakes which have now been inhabited by a wealth of nature and birdlife. They were initially created to build up drinking water reserves and supply the Charleroi-Brussels Canal. This bike ride takes you on beautiful parts of the RAVeL trail, embellished with the 'point noeuds' network, revealing all the beauty of this major natural and tourist centre in Wallonia. Stop off to relax on a lakeside beach, swim or enjoy a gourmet break.



Handy Tip: Lakeside Rides

There's so much to explore beyond the usual array of water activities. For example, the bike parc Natura Bike. There's a challenge for every bike enthusiast with 11 downhill trails of varying levels and an initiation centre for little ones. They also rent out electric scooters and offer several scenic routes around the lakes. If you fancy a tonic for your weary limbs, the wellbeing centre is a soothing option, whilst the forest park 'Natura Park' is great fun for treetop climbing, zip wiring and Jungle Book style adventures.







Must Visit: Tobacco Roads


The charming villages like Laforêt, once a thriving tobacco-growing area sit in a pretty green setting along the Semois river. It still retains its traditional atmosphere and rich cultural heritage with drinking troughs, washhouses and even tobacco dryers. Small farmhouses have distinctive façades of wood, stone and brick. Look out for the sweet details in their architecture: hearts (for luck and protection) on facades and barns, bull's eye windows, wooden frames...

Specific markings exist anywhere legislation allows you to ride. Just remember to protect nature on your way.


